These include Koreans, Mongolians, Nepalese, Bhutanese, Vietnamese, and formerly the Japanese before 1873. Lunar New Year is also celebrated in Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan, Singapore, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand and other countries or regions with major Han Chinese populations, and the celebration has, to varying degrees, become part of the traditional culture of these countries.


The Chinese Zodiac is based upon a twelve-year lunar cycle. Your sign is determined by the year in which you were born (to be accurate you must use a Chinese calendar). Each sign and those born under it, are

represented by one of twelve animals, and are ascribed a set of attributes the Chinese believe comprise

Legend has it the 12 animals of the Chinese Zodiac were chosen by Buddha. When Buddha was near

death he invited all the animals to visit him. Only 12 came: the rat, ox, tiger, rabbit,

dragon, snake, horse, goat (sheep), monkey, rooster, dog and pig. For visiting him, Buddha honoured each by using them to represent the 12 phases of the Zodiac.
